February 18th, First Sunday in Lent: Mindful Mandalas

February 25th, Second Sunday in Lent: Daffodil Meditative Drawing -inspired by the national flower of Wales and just in time for St. David's Day, take time to contemplate the beauty of God's creation

March 17th, Fifth Sunday in Lent: Peaceful Words Painting

-use canvas and acrylic paint to illuminate a word to draw yourself into the peace of God
