After dinner we discussed food insecurity on the Western campus, how the students can be actively involved in keeping our new food pantry stocked, and their ideas about items to keep on hand to restock as needed.

The students are going to take on the restocking of the pantry on Sunday evenings from the donations left in the church Sunday mornings. Below are some suggestions they had. However, I can't stress enough that we can't mess this up! As long as we buy things that won't go bad in the outdoor environment of our pantry and are motivated by love we are on the right track!



The students also assembled Blessing Bags that can be given to people expressing need that both they and parishioners encounter in our lives. If you would like to have some in your car to use when the need arises, please pick some up from the *Gathering Place*. There are two kinds: some have women's socks and tampons and others have men's socks. All bags have snacks, deodorant, toothbrushes, and toothpaste.

If these Blessing Bags turn out to be something we see as filling a need in our community, we will solicit additional sources for the items needed to make more.
