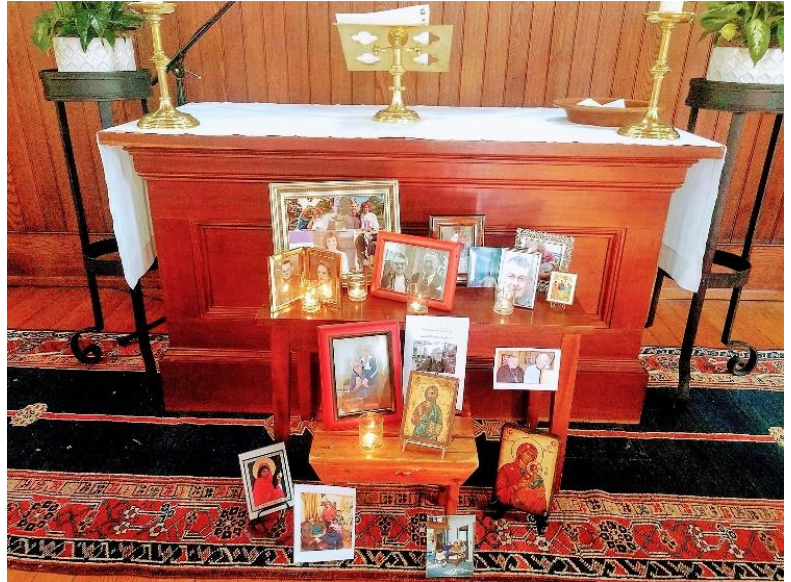

Lynching Commemoration March in Franklin

Saturday, November 6th, 7 pm

One hundred sixty-five documented lynchings took place in North Carolina between 1877 and 1950. In November of 1898, a black prisoner who had not yet gone to trial was taken from the jail in Franklin and hanged from the old steel bridge in east Franklin. His name was Mitchel Mozeley. In 1890, another black prisoner, also never having been tried, was similarly murdered in his jail cell in Haywood County. A mob had come to lynch him, and when they were not able to remove him from his cell, he was shot dozens of times still in his cell. His name was George Ratcliff. Now, people living in both of these communities want them remembered. These commemoration efforts are inspired by the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, Alabama.

There will be a march to commemorate the lynching of Mitchel Mozeley on Saturday, November 6th. The march will be at 7 pm and will originate at the county courthouse on Main Street in Franklin, then proceed to the nearby old jail building which still exists. It will end at the new bridge over the Little Tennessee River a few blocks away. Local history teacher, John DeVille, is a part of the effort and is quoted as saying “if we are going to be the best nation that we can be” . . . and “truly live up to democratic principles, then we have to confront not only the ugly chapters in our past, but also how those ugly chapters ripple forward.”
