Support for Advent Preparation

Advent is a season of interior preparation for the “new thing” God is doing in us, in our faith community, and in the world. The coming of the Christ is an ongoing revelation to us, a gift of a gracious God who knows and loves us so well that we are given continual access to the truth over time so that we can “bear it.” (Jn 16:12)

To aid in our preparation, I offer the opportunity to pray with icons, which I will set up in the upstairs parish hall for the duration of Advent. You can come individually or in groups as is convenient for you. You can also set up a time with me to teach or pray with you.

I also offer an outline for an individual spiritual retreat—a day or two away in prayerful solitude, along with some reading resources to aid in your listening. I recommend either of our conference centers: the [Valle Crucis hermitages](#) or [Lake Logan](#) for retreat locations.
