Easter Day is an historically rich time for the sacrament of Baptism. Baptisms have been celebrated on Easter since the time of the early church. Please let Michael know if anybody in your family would like to be baptized this Easter (April 16).

The Episcopal Church's theology of Confirmation has continued to evolve along with its understanding of baptism. Confirmation is no longer seen as the completion of Christian initiation, nor is Confirmation a prerequisite for receiving communion. Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's body the church. (From the Book of Common Prayer)

St. David's Timeline

By June Smith **1856**

When he was still a boy of 12, Daniel David Davies left home and spent the next ten years going to school as he could before and after work but spending his days working in the copper mines east of his home village. Feeling he had done all he could to advance himself in Wales, he sailed to America with a friend at the age of 22 and began working as an engineer with a firm in Pittsburgh.



For the next eight years, he explored land from Pittsburgh to South Georgia, looking for coal and copper and supervising the digging of the Western and Atlantic Railroad Tunnel. On one such trip he passed through Jackson County, found it looking much like his homeland, and discovered some copper deposits. He bought mineral rights to 2,000 acres and on his return trip from the south in 1856, settled in Cullowhee valley where he lived the rest of his life. He was 30 years old. He soon married, and he and his wife, Katharine Elizabeth Sensabaugh of Haywood County, had five daughters. Their large home of twenty rooms was named Forest Hill and stood on the hill across NC107 from WCU's football field.
